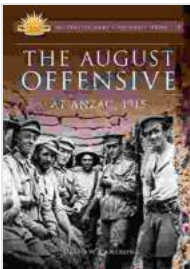


At Anzac 1915: A Journey Through the Australian Army Campaigns

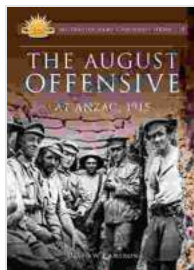
