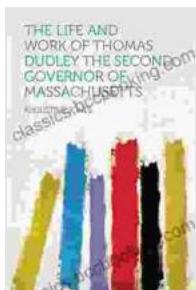
The Early Years of Thomas Dudley

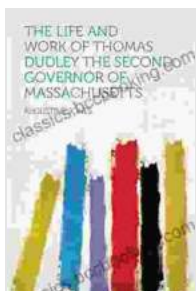
